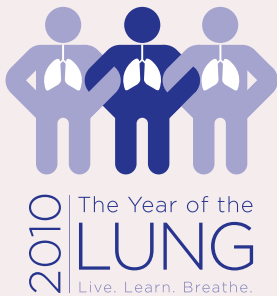

ACCP Simulation Center Sessions

Adult Tele-ICU

Tele-ICU is a growing part of critical care practice, with 10% of adult critical care patients in the United States now being supported by off-site providers. Take advantage of this opportunity to gain experience in health-care systems that provide tele-ICU services. This course is an ideal learning experience for those without tele-ICU experience and an opportunity to improve efficiency and skills for those with tele-ICU experience.

Airway Management

Every intubation in the ICU can be a difficult airway. Participate in a state-of-the-art, systematic overview and hands-on experience with the preparation, teamwork, and tools that it takes to manage common and complex airway situations.

- Review the fundamental skills of intubation.
- Identify exam findings associated with a difficult airway.
- Experience advanced tools for airway management.
- Work in teams to solve airway problems in a high-fidelity, simulated clinical environment using scenarios developed from real-life cases.



Bronchoscopy

Assess your current skills and learn new skills while working with experts in bronchoscopy. A significant portion of the course will be dedicated to learning endobronchial ultrasound and its application in real-time guidance of transbronchial needle aspiration. This is an excellent opportunity for anyone interested in basic and advanced diagnostic bronchoscopy.

Critical Care

Use various degrees of simulation for experiential learning in ventilator and airway management, invasive and noninvasive hemodynamic monitoring, and management of a critically ill patient. Breakouts during the course will include problem-based learning, task training, high-fidelity patient simulators, team-driven scenarios, and interactive debriefing enhanced with video recordings for reflective evaluation. Pulmonary Function Testing

Ultrasonography

Percussing the Chest in the Era of Homo Technologicus

Abraham Verghese, MD, MACP

In this era of technological glut, the bedside exam seems to belong to prehistoric times and is in danger of extinction. While the majority of diagnoses are readily made this way, the skilled bedside exam is a discrete ethnographic ritual which, like all rituals, has undergone transformation. New data suggest that the placebo (and the nocebo) effect depends so much on context, ceremony, ritual, and place and is associated with measurable neurobiological changes. The placebo effect might account for as much as 30% to 40% of any therapeutic effect. Preserving the bedside exam may not only help in practicing cost-effective medicine, it may be the key to the physician-patient bond and to producing the desired therapeutic effect.

About the Speaker

As founding director of the Center for Medical Humanities & Ethics at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, Abraham Verghese, MD, MACP, brought a deep-seated empathy for patient suffering. He saw empathy as a way to preserve the innate qualities that initially bring students to medical school but frequently become suppressed due to the rigors of training. He became more focused on bedside medicine along with the value of the physical examination in diagnosing patients and the role of attentiveness to patients and their families as a vital key in the healing process. In 2007, he was recruited to Stanford University School of Medicine, Stanford, CA, as a tenured professor and currently serves as Professor for the Theory and Practice of Medicine and Senior Associate Chair of the Department of Internal Medicine.

Dr. Verghese is the author of three best-selling books: *Cutting for Stone*, his first novel (now in paperback), and two non-fiction books, *My Own Country*, and *The Tennis Partner*, which were both critically acclaimed. He blogs regularly on The Atlantic.com, and his work has appeared in *The Wall Street Journal*, *New York Times*, and *The New Yorker*. 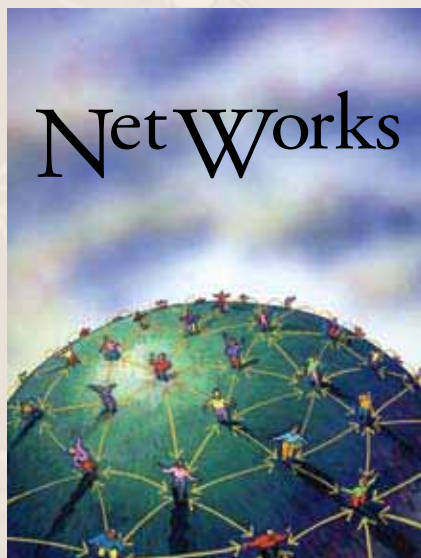

- Percussing the Chest in the Era of Homo Technologicus
Abraham Verghese, MD, MACP

Summary In this era of technological glut, the bedside exam seems to belong to prehistoric times and is in danger of extinction. While the majority of diagnoses are readily made this way, the skilled bedside exam is a discrete ethnographic ritual which, like all rituals, has undergone transformation. New data suggests that the placebo (and the nocebo) effect depends so much on context, ceremony, ritual, and place and is associated with measurable neurobiological changes. The placebo effect might account for as much as 30-40% of any therapeutic effect. Preserving the bedside exam may not only help in practicing cost-effective medicine, it may be the key to the physician-patient bond and to producing the desired therapeutic effect.

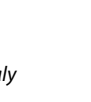

Keynote Address

Percussing the Chest in the Era of Homo Technologicus

Abraham Verghese, MD, MACP

In this era of technological glut, the bedside exam seems to belong to prehistoric times and is in danger of extinction. While the majority of diagnoses are readily made this way, the skilled bedside exam is a discrete ethnographic ritual which, like all rituals, has undergone transformation. New data suggest that the placebo (and the nocebo) effect depends so much on context, ceremony, ritual, and place and is associated with measurable neurobiological changes. The placebo effect might account for as much as 30% to 40% of any therapeutic effect. Preserving the bedside exam may not only help in practicing cost-effective medicine, it may be the key to the physician-patient bond and to producing the desired therapeutic effect.

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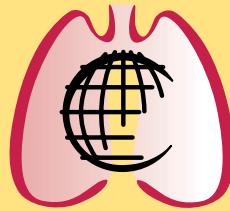

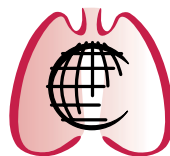
